Can we trust the New Testament?

In a culture that dismisses faith as unreasonable, can Christians remain confident that the Bible is both reliable and relevant?

Bible Society Australia, in partnership with AFES, presents an evening with the director of the Centre for Biblical Preaching in Melbourne, former Principal of Melbourne School of Theology and author of the 2004 Christian Book of the Year, Stirrings of the Soul, Mike Raiter.

In 2012 Bible Society Australia is running a campaign called "Live Light in 25 Words" to see people engage with the Bible and to develop a love of reading the Words of Scripture and apply them to their everyday life.
